Programm und Konzept der ersten Runde

Titel: "Musical possibilities beyond the extreme of Etudes."

Werke:

- Sergei Rachmaninov:Études-tableaux Op.39-1 C minor, Op39-2 A minor /10:00

Konzept:

Etudes are focused not only on the physical techniques of the fingers but also delved into musical elements such as harmony, rhythm, texture, and tone. Each etude requires the mastery of specific content, which is repeated throughout the piece.

Franz Liszt, renowned for his highly technical compositions, also composed a series of 12 etudes. In his etude S.139-12, a continuous tremolo resonates from beginning to end, accompanied by a chromatic passage in the middle. A delicate and captivating melody consisting of only six notes is played over this backdrop. Furthermore, this piece is subtitled "Chasse-neige" and the combination of tremolo, chromatic harmony, and melody creates a sophisticated artistic work that portrays a snowy landscape.

On the other hand, Rachmaninov conceived his etudes as a collection of picturesque pieces, particularly evident in op.39-1 and op.39-2. Op.39-1 is characterized by a demanding right-hand part with wide pitch leaps and constant syncopation of the melody. They evoke powerful, untamed emotions, not only through advanced playing techniques and complex musical elements but also through changes in time signature and irregular phrase structures. In op.39-2, which bears the subtitle "Sea and Gulls," a melancholic and tragic atmosphere prevails. The performance technique may appear simple, but the intricate textures and complex musical elements, such as cross-rhythms, make it challenging to convey the intended scene.

Kapustin's etudes incorporate homophonic forms, frequently blending jazz and rock styles. They showcase the characteristic rhythms and specific techniques found in Kapustin's compositions.

Every composer has their own unique musical techniques, which can be learned through performing their repertoire. Debussy's etude No. 10, for instance, is replete with bold nuances, tonal overlaps, and the artful expansion of sound—a hallmark of his piano music. Debussy's musical character is taken to the utmost refinement in this etude.

Etudes are not solely meant for technical training but are intricately connected to exceptional performance technique and a high level of musicality. In other words, the essence of an etude lies in its exploration of the fundamental qualities required for advanced performance technique while expressing the musical content at hand.

Beethoven's Piano Sonata No. 28 sets the stage for the exploration of love's different forms. From the delicate and introspective Allegretto to the lively and spirited Vivace alla Marcia, this Sonata embodies the contrasting emotions and complexities of love.
